2022 MEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES QUICK LIST

Red Cliffs Range is open to its members and to the public for their shooting pleasure. This range is operated solely by volunteer members and we depend on our club to keep the range safe, clean, and always improving. As a member, please read your SOP's for all detailed rules and policies regarding the range and the club. This handout serves as a quick reminder of some important members' responsibilities.

- All members are required to visibly wear their current membership I.D. badge when shooting at range, at both the shooting bays and at the main range.
- All members must check in with the RAO at the office every time they come to shoot and sign a liability waiver, etc.
- All guests accompanying the member must also sign the liability waiver at the office each time, whether they are actively shooting or just observing. All children's names must be listed and the adult must sign for them.
- Members may bring one guest at no charge. If more than one guest, shooting fees will apply.
- Members must obey the Range Safety Officers' instructions at the main range.
- Members are responsible for their guests and responsible for picking up their brass and cleaning up after themselves.
- When shooting in the bays, all targets must be placed within 5 yards of the berm. Only paper or steel targets are authorized. No shooting objects on the ground.
- Children must be under direct adult supervision at all times at the range.
- No dogs are allowed at the main range or in the shooting bays.
- Members must keep a current contact number and mailing address on file.
- All important communications regarding the range, closures, any policy changes, and range rules are sent out to members via email.
- No shooting while under the influence of alcohol or mind altering drugs.
- If a member observes safety violations occurring, we ask them to notify the in-charge RSO at the main range, the office, or you may notify the shooter of the violation in a friendly manner. Most safety violations are done unknowingly and unintentionally.
- Children must be 8 years old or older to be at the main range. Does not apply in shooting bays.
